

Mitchell County Fair

Rules and Regulations

1. All open class entries are to be made in person with the entry clerk and be filed no later than 12 noon on Tuesday, August 1, 2023.
2. All parties making an entry must secure an exhibitor's ticket. There is no charge for any entries.
3. No animal or article may be removed before designated time except by special arrangements. (Open class and 4-H release times may be different)
4. Exhibitors will be furnished with cards, containing numbers and such cards should be attached to, or placed near the article to which it refers.
5. Every article or animal entered for competition shall be under the control of the executive committee but the association will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur.
6. Judges are requested to give reasons for all placings.
7. No premiums will be paid on anything not listed in the premium list.
8. Decision of the judges will be final.
9. In case of dispute, where no rules of this association are applicable, the rules of the Iowa State Fair shall be binding.
10. In all departments where there is only one exhibitor, only one premium may be awarded.
11. Each superintendent shall have full charge of his/her department subject to the orders of the executive committee.
12. Tags may be secured on entry day at the Fairgrounds Office.
13. Resolution adopted by Board of Directors of the Mitchell County Agricultural Society June, 29, 1934.
14. **All premiums not collected in 30 days after issued will be considered forfeited to the County Fair.**

Protests

1. Protests against an awarding committee on the grounds of incompetency or previous bias must be made to the superintendent before the award of the committee is made.
2. Protest against an award must be made in writing, accompanied by an affidavit, to the Secretary, and before noon of the day following the making of such award. The Secretary shall notify the exhibitor of the protested animal or article of such protest and both parties then have 10 days to bring sworn testimony in the case to be submitted to the directors.
3. In case the protestants assume any interference with the awarding committee by false statements or corrupt action by a judge, such charges must be made specific and on oath; the party so charged having 10 days time for testimony and rebuttal.
4. In event of protests, exhibitors and protesters must gather in front of the grandstand between 7am and 8am on August 4, 2023.
5. No other protest will be considered by manager or board.

REQUIREMENTS OF LIVESTOCK FOR EXHIBITION IN STATE OF IOWA

All livestock presented for exhibition at the Iowa State Fair or any fair or exhibition within the State of Iowa will be considered under quarantine and not eligible for showing until the owner or agent presents the proper health certificates stating the animals comply with the rules and regulations. Official health certificates must be regulations. Official health certificates must be presented to and approved by the veterinary inspector in charge of the Fair or exhibition before time of showing. Copies of complete rules and regulations available at Secretary’s office, Extension Office, or from Fair Veterinarian.

See specific departments for exhibit submission time and guidelines.

All exhibits MUST be recorded in the Fair Office located in the CRC Events Center.
